

EHR Adoption Stats

According to a 2015 National Electronic Health Records Survey (NEHRS), 87% of physicians reported using an EHR system and 78% reported using a Certified EHR system.

The states with the highest adoption rates are Wyoming (79%), South Dakota (77%), Utah (75%), Iowa (75%), and North Dakota (74%).

Since 2008, office-based physician adoption of an EHR has nearly doubled, from 42% to 87%.

Physician specialties with the highest adoption rates are internal medicine / pediatrics (76%), nephrology (75%), family practice (75%) and urology (74%).

Telehealth

HB 7087 (2016) / 2016-240 L.O.F.

- Telehealth Advisory Council: 15 members including the Secretary of AHCA (Chair) and the Surgeon General (member)
- 2. Survey for current capabilities, utilization and coverage levels:
 - AHCA to survey licensed health care facilities
 - DOH to survey licensed health care practitioners
 - OIR to survey health plans and HMOs
- AHCA to submit a report of survey findings to the Governor, Senate President, and Speaker of the House by 12/31/2016
- 4. Final Advisory Council report of **recommendations** to increase the use and accessibility of telehealth services by **10/31/2017**




e-Prescribing Metrics

- The Agency produces a quarterly dashboard of metrics
 - www.FHIN.net
 - Provides statewide adoption and use trending
 - Shows comparison of Florida to national e-prescribing rates
- Florida has seen a steady increase in e-prescribing since the inception of the initiative in 2007
- Data collection for e-prescribing of controlled substances (EPCS) began in 2015

Enablement Status of EPCS for Florida

Prescribers

Prescribers must utilize EHR software that is EPCS certified and audit approved to enable e-prescribing of controlled substance

As of September 2016, approximately 3.2% of active e-prescribers in Florida have been enabled to prescribe controlled substances

As of September 2017, approximately 7.4% of active e-prescribers in Florida have been enabled to prescribe controlled substances

Pharmacies

Pharmacies must be ready to receive EPCS transactions from prescribers with approved software


As of September 2016, 79.9% of pharmacies in Florida are enabled to receive e-prescribed controlled substances

As of September 2017, 86.5% of pharmacies in Florida are enabled to receive e-prescribed controlled substances

Secure Messaging

- Basic, secure, HIPAA-compliant exchange
 - Push model of exchange
 - Uses industry-developed Direct standards
 - Strict identity verification standards for users
 - Supports transport of documents of any format
- DirectTrust accreditation means that users can exchange with a trusted nationwide network of over 1.3 million users
- Florida HIE Services Direct Messaging is an inexpensive web-based alternative for Florida providers





Query Exchange

- Built on the nationwide eHealth Exchange platform
 - Allows providers to query for patient clinical records
 - Federated network with no centralized data repository
 - Common data standards, legal agreement, and governance
 - Covers 100M patients nationwide
- Assists in meeting the health information exchange requirements of Meaningful Use, which includes
 - Electronically exchanging summary of care records
 - Incorporating electronic summary of care records into an EHR
 - Performing clinical reconciliation using received summary of care records

Encounter Notification Service (ENS)


- Offers timely notice of patient hospital encounters to health care providers and health plans.
 - 215 hospitals covering 95% of all acute care hospital beds in Florida share data
 - Patient-authorized exchange
 - Improves care coordination and transitions of care
 - Reduces hospital admissions and readmissions
 - Supports value-based payment models





ENS Subscribers

- 40 current subscribers
 - 23 accountable care organizations
 - 12 health plans
 - 4 ambulatory providers
 - 1 hospital system





ENS and ROI

- One participating ACO was able to use ENS to transition patient care to their offices within two weeks on 79% of hospital discharges
- The same ACO was able to reduce post-discharge expenses by \$1,882 per episode when a TCM code was billed
 - Medicare Transition of Care Management billing codes 99495 and 99496
